Gary writes..... The Common Cup

We have recently reintroduced the Common Cup at St. Peter's following its suspension during the pandemic, giving those who receive communion the option of either receiving the bread and the wine, or just the bread alone.

It is important to state that reception in one kind, i.e. the bread alone, is regarded as a full and complete communion, and no-one should feel any pressure to receive in both kinds if they have any concerns about doing so.

If you prefer not to drink from the chalice, then you are encouraged to make your way back to your seat after receiving the bread.

For those who *do* choose to receive the wine, the chalice will be cleaned and given a quarter turn between each communicant.

During the pandemic, and beyond, provision was made by the C of E for the person administering communion, most often the priest but not always, to fully hand sanitise and dip the bread into the wine, so that those receiving could receive both; this was called the 'simultaneous administration of the consecrated bread and wine' by the C of E.

This practice has now stopped at St. Peter's.

But what about intinction?

Intinction is where you receive the bread and wine, at the same time, by dipping your *own* bread into the wine. Whilst this avoids having to sip from the Common Cup, which some people feel makes it more hygienic, it is in fact *less* hygienic, due to the potential for germs (and other things) on fingertips to enter into the wine. The most hygienic way is to sip from the cup and allow the alcohol in the wine and the silver of the chalice to do their work.

The practice of intinction is no longer permitted in the C of E, so please don't try to dip your own bread into the wine.

I encourage you to prayerfully reflect on whether you wish to receive the Common Cup and, however you receive communion, may it be a tangible grace bestowed upon you. May it remind you that you have been redeemed by the precious Blood of Christ, reassure you of the forgiveness of sins and the deep love God has for you, and proclaim the Lord's death until he comes again.

Foundation Governors Needed!

Leckhampton Primary is a Church of England Voluntary Controlled school. This means that it is a local authority school run by the head teacher and her management team, overseen by the school's governing body. There are three foundation governors, appointed by The Diocese of Gloucester, in addition to the vicar of St. Peter's who is an ex-officio governor. They promote links between the school and the church as well as serving alongside governors appointed by parents, staff and the local authority.

Governors serve a four year term of office. We currently have a vacancy and, with another governor finishing their term soon, we are looking for two volunteers, who would be interested in taking on the role. Training will be provided. All governors attend Main Governing Body meetings at the school. They also are on one or more committee, are involved in visiting the school and reporting back to the governing body. The time commitment is variable, averaging about eight hours a month (term time only).

Recognising the difference a volunteer can make

Jane Brown served 10 years as Parish Safeguarding Officer at St Lawrence, Barnwood, Gloucester. Having stepped down, we reflect on the lasting impression she made to her worshipping community and the wider diocesan team.

In her time acting as PSO, Jane raised the profile of safeguarding among the worshipping community at St Lawrence. Out of 65 roles, including clergy, church officers and volunteers, a fantastic 91% have completed the appropriate safeguarding training in the past year, to help keep them and those around them safe in the church. She's also been responsible for keeping DBS checks up to date.

The Revd Rob Crofton said, "Jane has done a fantastic job in overseeing this important area. She's supported me as vicar in dealing with any safeguarding issues that have arisen and ensured our PCC is regularly kept informed about safeguarding matters. She's dealt with the reviewing and publishing of our policies and ensured that we are compliant with our procedures.

"We are all really grateful to her for all she has done. She has now handed the baton to our new PSO, Heather Walker, and we wish Jane every blessing in her next steps of serving God."

Jane has encouraged all the volunteers to do safeguarding training. If people were not comfortable with learning online, Jane arranged in-person sessions for them and has also helped with arranging Farsi language training for Iranian volunteers.

She's worked closely with the Diocesan Safeguarding team and has been a valued part of the PSO network meetings.

Becca Faal, the diocesan Strategic Lead for Safeguarding Training and Learning said, "Jane has been a delight to have in our wider team of parish safeguarding officers. She has been very dedicated to the role and has also been very encouraging and supportive to the Diocesan Safeguarding team."

Jane says, "What a privilege it has been to be one of the first PSOs in Gloucester Diocese ten years ago. I have particularly enjoyed encouraging church officers and volunteers to come to understand safeguarding and promoting the culture and training courses. A last special piece of work was to help to facilitate faceto-face training for our Iranian church volunteers.

"It has been emotional to finally step down from this role but with honour and pride to have been called by God to do this vital and rewarding work."
