'Notes from the Director of Music'



April sees us fully immerse ourselves into the feast of music available as part of the Easter season. That includes some of the great hymnody available (lots of 'alleluia's...!) as well as choral music. We will be introducing a new congregational communion setting for the Gloria, Sanctus, Benedictus and Agnus Dei - our final one for the year - which will see us through to the end of August. It is called the 'Salisbury Service' composed by Grayston Ives. Ives was organist at Magdalen College, Oxford for the majority of his musical career, having held other posts including being a member of the King's Singers between 1978-1985. I hope that you will enjoy learning a new setting along with the choir. It is very singable with some memorable melodies, and it will help to enhance our collective worship. May intention is to have three settings of the communion music so that we can use one per 'term' (autumn, spring and summer) throughout a year. This new Ives setting will complete our collection (along with the Thorne 'Mass of St. Thomas that you used to use at St. Peter's before my arrival, and the current Ledger 'Classical Communion Service'). Our first Sunday of the month music will remain the same throughout the year for consistency - and that will mean we have a rich variety of music for the congregation to enjoy participating in alongside the wonderful hymns that we all share together too.

The three anthems we will sing during April (no choir on the first Sunday of this month - as they will be having a well-earned rest after the busy Easter period!) are Elgar's 'Ave Verum' (a familiar favourite), Goodall's 'Psalm 23' and Aston 'I am the true vine'. The latter two are new items to the choir. The Goodall is - perhaps - better known as the theme tune to the 'Vicar of Dibley' TV sitcom. However, it is beautifully written for a choir, and I hope you will enjoy listening to it as much as we will performing it. The Aston anthem is chosen to echo the theme of the readings that Sunday, and we last sang a piece by Aston at Remembrance. I am fond of his work, it is always well written for voices and with his own unique style.

Reordering

The reordering project, which we started in earnest in 2015, has now been completed, and it looks impressive. It took longer than anticipated because of the Covid Pandemic, which prevented meetings with architects and other professionals, the gas boiler finally gave up so time and resources had to be redirected to a new system of heating, which meant that 3-phase electricity had to be routed under the path from the road to the church, faculty applications had to be submitted and approved by the chancellor.

From this......



When the old pine flooring was removed it revealed joists supported by columns of bricks without any mortar, a lot of dumped rubble, including a bag of cement, a rotten joist under the left front pew, a tunnel leading to the old boiler room below the vestry and a large pipe coming from the organ,

(Various explanations, including for a water-powered bellows for a previous organ.)

.....to this!



The approval of the carpet posed problems. Our original choice was not allowed as it contained the wrong type of glue. Fortunately we found a supplier in Winchcombe who could meet the requirements.

The particular red was chosen because it 'echoes' the red of the stained glass windows.

Before the carpet was finally laid we placed a Time Capsule, with various artefacts relating to St Peter's, through one of the inspection hatches in the floor. Not to be opened until 2074

Interesting fact: To apply for the faculty for the Chancellor's approval Gary and I submitted **sixty-one** documents. The Completion Certificate will be number **62**.

"People are surprised to see a DJ in a clerical collar"

A vicar from Tetbury is using his love for music to share God's love through DJing at festivals and events. The Revd Steve Bullock shares how he developed his 'musical ministry' and the reactions he gets from listeners.

The Revd Steve Bullock was ordained priest in June 2023 and is serving his curacy in the benefice of Tetbury, Long Newnton, Beverston and Shipton Moyne. Steve is also a trained DJ, who goes by the name 'Rev Steve'. Steve says, "I have a musical background, classically trained as a clarinet and piano player from an early age and a member of a high-performing church choir, I appreciate all this genre has to offer. However, over the years I have found that other genres of music have helped me connect with God also, especially different styles of dance music.

"This eventually drew me into exploring how I could get hold of such music and play around with it, to help me and others connect with God, through the spirituality which is often found in such music. This led me to get hold of my

first DJ decks and I have been steadily developing my skillset, undertaking courses and being mentored by Mark Spence from DJ Gym, Birmingham, to get to the standard I'm at today."

Steve is mindful of the songs he plays and that his music brings joy.

"I prefer not to play at parties and weddings, as the music is usually dictated by the audience rather than the DJ and it is harder to keep watch of the content of the messages in the songs. This is important as I want my mixes to be positive and pointing towards joy and hope. In fact, at one of my gigs last year, I was playing in a back room, with another DJ playing in the other space. It was noted there was a difference between what we played. Someone noticed that there was a contrast between light and dark, which I thought proved what I try to do with the music.

"So far, I've had some great feedback to my mixes and mini gigs. People are usually surprised to see me wearing my clerical collar, which immediately gets people's attention. I'm one for trying to debunk stereotypes and if I can use it to make people think more about Christ, wherever they are, that is great." Bream C of E celebrating 'good' results for first time in 22 years

Bream Church of England Primary School, near Lydney, has been awarded a 'good' rating across all areas in its latest Ofsted inspection.

Under new headteacher Nicky Brice, it's progressed rapidly since the last

inspection in 2019 where the school was rated 'inadequate'. This is the first time in 22 years the school has been judged to be 'good'.

In 2021, the school joined the Severn Federation Academy Trust, led by Trust CEO Rachel Dare, with Louisa Davies as Chair of the Board of Trustees. Nicky Brice took on the post of headteacher, coming to the role from Aylburton Primary. Since this time the school has rapidly improved in all areas. She said, "We are all so proud of our children who show such a love for this school and enthusiasm for their learning, the staff who have worked tirelessly and for all of our families for their ongoing support and backing throughout this rapid journey of improvement."

Jane Borgeaud, the Diocesan Director of Education, said, "The transformation that has been achieved for this school, as a result of the staff's dedication and ambition, enables its pupils to live out the school's vision, being the best that they can be and growing from acorns to oaks, flourishing in God's love."




