The Palm Gospel

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N* Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the reading:

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Let us go forth, praising Jesus our Messiah...

We process up to church singing:

All glory, laud, and honour to thee, Redeemer, King! to whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring.

Mark 14.32-15.39

Hear the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

Please sit for the passion drama and join in with the parts in **bold**.

Part 1: Jesus Prays in Gethsemane

Narrator: They went to a place called Gethsemane; and Jesus said to his

disciples,

Jesus: 'Sit here while I pray.'

Narrator: He took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be

distressed and agitated. And he said to them,

Jesus: 'I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and keep

awake.'

Narrator: And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and

prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him.

He said.

lesus 'Abba, Father, for you all things are possible; remove this cup

from me; yet, not what I want, but what you want.'

Narrator: He came and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter,

Jesus: 'Simon, are you asleep? Could you not keep awake one hour?

Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of

trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.'

Narrator: And again he went away and prayed, saying the same words.

And once more he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy; and they did not know what to say to him. He

came a third time and said to them,

Jesus: 'Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? Enough! The hour

has come; the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.

Get up, let us be going. See, my betrayer is at hand.'

Part 2: The Betrayal and Arrest of Jesus

Narrator: Immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the

twelve, arrived; and with him there was a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders.

Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,

Judas: 'The one I will kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away

under guard.'

Narrator: So when he came, he went up to him at once and said,

Judas: 'Rabbi!'

Narrator: and kissed him. Then they laid hands on him and arrested him.

But one of those who stood near drew his sword and struck the slave of the high priest, cutting off his ear. Then Jesus said to

them,

Jesus: 'Have you come out with swords and clubs to arrest me as

though I were a bandit? Day after day I was with you in the temple teaching, and you did not arrest me. But let the

scriptures be fulfilled.'

Narrator: All of them deserted him and fled. A certain young man was

following him, wearing nothing but a linen cloth. They caught hold of him, but he left the linen cloth and ran off naked.

Part 3: Jesus before the Council

Narrator: They took Jesus to the high priest; and all the chief priests, the

elders, and the scribes were assembled. Peter had followed him at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest; and he was sitting with the guards, warming himself at the fire. Now the chief priests and the whole council were looking for testimony against Jesus to put him to death; but they found none. Many gave false testimony against, but it did not agree. Others stood

to give false testimony against him, saying,

Witnesses: 'We heard him say, "I will destroy this temple that is

made with hands, and in three days I will build another,

not made with hands."'

Narrator: But even on this point their testimony did not agree. Then the

high priest stood up before them and asked Jesus,

High Priest: 'Have you no answer? What is it that they testify against you?'

Narrator: But he was silent and did not answer. Again the high priest

asked him,

High Priest: 'Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?'

Jesus: 'I am; you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of

the Power coming with the clouds of heaven."

Narrator: Then the high priest tore his clothes and said,

High Priest: 'Why do we still need witnesses? You have heard his blasphemy!

What is your decision?'

Narrator: All of them condemned him as deserving death. Some began to

spit on him, to blindfold him, and to strike him, saying to him,

Crowd: 'Prophesy!'

Narrator: The guards also took him over and beat him.

Part 4: Peter Denies Jesus

Narrator: While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant-girls

of the high priest came by. When she saw Peter warming

himself, she stared at him and said,

Servant girl: 'You also were with Jesus, the man from Nazareth.'

Narrator: But he denied it, saying,

Peter: 'I do not know or understand what you are talking about.'

Narrator: And he went out into the forecourt. Then the cock crowed.

And the servant-girl, on seeing him, began again to say to the

bystanders,

Servant girl: 'This man is one of them.'

Narrator: But again he denied it. Then after a little while the bystanders

again said to Peter,

Servant girl: 'Certainly you are one of them; for you are a Galilean.'

Narrator: But he began to curse, and he swore an oath,

Peter: 'I do not know this man you are talking about.'

Narrator: At that moment the cock crowed for the second time. Then

Peter remembered that Jesus had said to him, 'Before the cock

crows twice, you will deny me three times.'

Narrator: And he broke down and wept.

Part 5: Jesus before Pilate

Narrator: As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation

with the elders and scribes and the whole council. They bound lesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate asked

him,

Pilate: 'Are you the King of the Jews?'

Jesus: 'You say so.'

Narrator: Then the chief priests accused him of many things. Pilate asked

him again,

Pilate: 'Have you no answer? See how many charges they bring against

you.'

Narrator: But Jesus made no further reply, so that Pilate was amazed.

Part 6: Pilate Hands Jesus over to Be Crucified

Narrator: Now at the festival he used to release a prisoner for them,

anyone for whom they asked. Now a man called Barabbas was in prison with the rebels who had committed murder during the insurrection. So the crowd came and began to ask Pilate to do for them according to his custom. Then he answered them,

Pilate: 'Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?'

Narrator: For he realised that it was out of jealousy that the chief priests

had handed him over. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas for them instead. Pilate spoke to

them again,

Pilate: 'Then what do you wish me to do with the man you call the

King of the Jews?'

Narrator: They shouted back,

Crowd: 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' [LOUD]

Pilate: 'Why, what evil has he done?'

Narrator: But they shouted all the more:

Crowd: 'Crucify him! Crucify him' [LOUDER]

Narrator: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for

them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be

crucified.

Part 7: The Soldiers Mock Jesus

Narrator: Then the soldiers led him into the courtyard of the palace (that

is, the governor's headquarters); and they called together the whole cohort. And they clothed him in a purple cloak; and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on him. And they

began saluting him,

Soldiers: 'Hail, King of the Jews!'

Narrator: They struck his head with a reed, spat upon him, and knelt

down in homage to him. After mocking him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. Then they

led him out to crucify him.

Part 8: The Crucifixion of Jesus

Narrator: They compelled a passer-by, who was coming in from the

country, to carry his cross; it was Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus. Then they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull). And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh; but he did not take it. And they crucified him, and divided his clothes among them, casting

lots to decide what each should take.

It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. The

inscription of the charge against him read, 'The King of the

Jews.' And with him they crucified two bandits, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying,

Passers by: 'Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in

three days, save yourself, and come down from the

cross!'

Narrator: In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes, were

also mocking him among themselves and saying,

Priests: 'He saved others; he cannot save himself. Let the Messiah, the

King of Israel, come down from the cross now, so that we may

see and believe.'

Narrator: Those who were crucified with him also taunted him.

Part 9: The Death of Jesus

Narrator: When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until

three in the afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a

loud voice,

Jesus: 'Eloi, Eloi, Iema sabachthani?'

Narrator: which means, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?'

When some of the bystanders heard it, they said,

Passers by: 'Listen, he is calling for Elijah.'

Narrator: And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a

stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying,

Soldier: 'Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down.'

Narrator: Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain

of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he

breathed his last, he said,

Centurion: 'Truly this man was the Son of God!'

This is the Passion of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Please stand.

Let us declare our faith in God:

We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high.

We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.





Let us give thanks to the Lord our God It is right to give thanks and praise

It is indeed right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

For as the time of his passion and resurrection draws near the whole world is called to acknowledge his hidden majesty. The power of the life-giving cross reveals the judgement that has come upon the world and the triumph of Christ crucified.

He is the victim who dies no more, the Lamb once slain, who lives for ever, our advocate in heaven to plead our cause, exalting us there to join with angels and archangels, for ever praising you and singing:





Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ †

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:

'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:

'Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send your Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:


Our Father in heaven,
