


Holy Communion



Remembrance Sunday

Welcome to St. Peter's for this act of worship and remembrance.

This time of year is marked by the theme of remembrance as we remember those who gave their lives in war so that we can enjoy the benefits we so often take for granted. We also pray for those who suffer as a result of war and those who make decisions that affect the lives of others.

At the heart of this service we express our communion with God whose love for all creation is revealed in Jesus Christ. We make this act of worship and remembrance for ourselves, for all whom we live and work with, for those whom we love but see no longer, and for those who have died in the service of this country.

We also remember those who have lost their lives due to the Coronavirus pandemic and all those who have given theirs willingly in the support and care of others.

The choir sings the Alleluia, the congregation then repeats:




Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N Glory to you, O Lord.

We Give Thanks

Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour and the majesty; for everything in heaven and on earth is yours. All things come from you, and of your own do we give you.

We Celebrate

Please remain standing.

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation; in your love you made us for yourself When we turned away you did not reject us, but came to meet us in your Son.

You embraced us as your children And welcomed us to sit and eat with you

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us. He opened his arms of love on the cross and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friends he took bread, and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to them saying:

'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

Father, we do this in remembrance of him: His body is the bread of life

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:


'Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins; do this in remembrance of me.'


Father, we do this in remembrance of him: His blood is shed for all.

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Invitation to Communion

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

Jesus Christ is holy, Jesus Christ is Lord,

We Share the Bread and Wine

All are invited to come forward to receive Holy Communion.

You are very welcome to make your own decision as to whether to receive the bread alone or the bread and the wine.

If you prefer not to drink from the chalice, then please make your way back to your seat after receiving the bread.

Dipping your own bread into the wine of the chalice is no longer permitted.

If you would rather receive a blessing, please keep your hands down and your head bowed.

Please let one of the stewards know if you would like to receive communion, or a blessing, in your seat.

The choir will sing an anthem.

Prayer after Communion

We pray together:

You have opened to us the Scriptures, O Christ, and you have made yourself know in the breaking of the bread.

Abide with us, we pray, that, blessed by your royal presence, we may walk with you all the days of our life, and at its end behold you in the glory of the eternal Trinity, one God for ever and ever.

Act of Remembrance

Let us remember before God, and commend to his sure keeping those who have died for their country in war; those whom we knew, and whose memory we treasure; and all who have lived and died in the service of mankind.

The names of the fallen are read.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them.

The Silence

The Last Post is played followed by a two minute silence.

At the end of the silence, the Reveille is played.

The Kohima

The words from the Kohima memorial are read:

'When you go home, tell them of us and say – for your tomorrow, we gave our today.'
