Then at the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

Please sit.

Please stand.

Let us declare our faith together:

We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high.

We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

We hear the Eucharistic Prayer; taken from the Greek word 'eucharistos' ($\varepsilon \dot{v} \chi \acute{\alpha} \rho \iota \sigma \tau o \varsigma$), meaning 'to give thanks'.

Please remain standing.

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.



For the first 3 Sundays in Advent

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

For when he humbled himself to come among us in human flesh, he fulfilled the plan, which you formed before the foundation of the world, to open for us the way of salvation.

Confident that your promise will be fulfilled, we now watch and wait for the day when Christ will come again in glory.


For the 4th Sunday in Advent

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

For he is the one foretold by all the prophets, the one whom Mary bore and loved beyond all telling, the one whom John the Baptist made known when at last he came.

As we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth, we now watch and wait for the day when he will come again in glory.

And so we join our voices with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, to proclaim your glory, forever praising you and singing:



Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood †

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:

'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:

'Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

The deacon proclaims:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

Please sit or kneel.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name thy kingdom come, thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever.


Amen.

The Communion

We share Holy Communion with each other; taken from the Greek word 'koinonia' $(\kappa o \iota \nu \omega \nu \iota \alpha)$, meaning 'communion, fellowship, sharing'.

All are invited to come forward to receive the bread and wine.

If you would rather receive a blessing, please keep your hands down and head bowed.

Please let one of the stewards know if you would like to receive Communion or a blessing in your seat.

The choir will sing an anthem.

After Communion

We pray together:

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice.

Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory.

Amen.

Final Hymn

Please stand to sing.

The Blessing

Christ the Sun of Righteousness shine upon you, scatter the darkness from before your path, and make you ready to meet him when he comes in glory.

And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit † be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The deacon sends us out into the world:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. In the name of Christ. Amen.

THE ADVENT WREATH

The following responses may be said or sung as the Advent candles are lit

ADVENT I

'The Advent Hope'

Jesus said, 'Keep awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.'

Amen. Come soon, Lord Jesus!

The first (purple coloured) candle is lit and this response is used:

Jesus is the light of the world.

A light no darkness can ever put out.

We sing:

Advent candles tell their story as we watch and pray, longing for the Day of Glory, 'Come, Lord, soon,' we say. Pain and sorrow, tears and sadness, changed for gladness on that Day.

ADVENT 2

'The Prophets'

Jesus said, 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets: I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them.'

Amen. Come soon, Lord Jesus!

The second (purple coloured) candle is lit and this response is used:

Jesus is the light of the world.

A light no darkness can ever put out.

We sing:

Advent candles tell their story as we watch and pray, longing for the Day of Glory, 'Come, Lord, soon,' we say. Pain and sorrow, tears and sadness changed for gladness on that Day.

Prophet voices loudly crying, making pathways clear; glimpsing glory, self-denying, calling all to hear.
Through their message - challenged, shaken — hearts awaken:
God is near!

ADVENT 3

'John the Baptist'

Jesus said, 'No one more important than John the Baptist has ever been born; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.'

Amen. Come soon, Lord Jesus!

The third (rose coloured) candle is lit and this response is used:

Jesus is the light of the world.

A light no darkness can ever put out.

We sing:

Advent candles tell their story as we watch and pray, longing for the Day of Glory, 'Come, Lord, soon,' we say. Pain and sorrow, tears and sadness changed for gladness on that Day.

John the Baptist, by his preaching and by water poured, brought to those who heard his teaching news of hope restored: 'Keep your vision strong and steady, and be ready for the Lord.'

ADVENT 4

'Mary'

Jesus said, 'Anyone who does what my Father in heaven wants is my brother or sister or mother.'

I am the servant of the Lord. Let it be to me according to his word.

The fourth (purple coloured) candle is lit and this response is used:

Jesus is the light of the world.

A light no darkness can ever put out.

We sing:

Advent candles tell their story as we watch and pray, longing for the Day of Glory, 'Come, Lord, soon,' we say. Pain and sorrow, tears and sadness changed for gladness, on that Day.

Mary's gift, beyond all telling, was to give Christ room.

She gave God a human dwelling in a mother's womb.

Who could guess the final story?

Cross and glory;

empty tomb!

GAUDETE GLORIA
