The first Book of Remembrance

If you have been to look at the WW1 Book of Remembrance, you would also have noticed a smaller book next to it, bound in carved oak. This also contains the names of the fallen, written in a neat hand on vellum pages. Because of its uniqueness it will be deposited in Gloucestershire Archives and has been replaced with a facsimile copy. The book was the work of

Miss Beata Legh of Minchinhampton, in 1921. She had no obvious connection with Leckhampton, so why might she have become involved? It can only have been through personal contact.

She was a descendant of the wealthy Legh family that had once owned Lyme Park in Cheshire (now a National Trust property). She was keen on amateur theatricals and was reported as having appeared in *tableaux vivants* in aid of the General Hospital. At rehearsals would have met fellow thespian Frederick Delmar-Williamson, whose son George was a lieutenant in the Black Watch attached to the Royal Flying Corps and died in a flying accident in 1918. He has a prominent memorial in our churchyard. It is likely that she learned from the father that there were plans to place a book of remembrance in Leckhampton church as a form of war memorial and - perhaps having some skill in calligraphy - she offered her services or was asked to write out a roll of honour.

Beata was also a member of the Cheltenham Archers (where her sister Alice was celebrated as 'the greatest woman archer of all time'). There another contact was Rose du Boulay, whose two brothers Arthur and Hubert Houssemaine du Boulay died in the war. They were not from the parish but are commemorated in our churchyard on the grave of their father.

'Notes from the Director of Music'



Well, what a fantastic November we had from a musical point of view. Both the Faure Requiem for

Remembrance Sunday and the Chorister Coffee Concert were 'new' events that we've not done before, but were very well received and certainly something we will aim to do more of in future.

December promises a feast of festive music, and this will include Advent Carols on December 1st (again, not something the church has done for a number of years), 9 Lessons and Carols, Midnight Mass and all the other services too. We'll certainly be getting our money's worth out of the choir (well, except they all do it for love and not money of course!).

There is actually too much music to go through in my usual amount of detail, so I will simply highlight a few key things to look out for instead (!). There are a number of items in the Advent Carol service for the choir to perform - but we also including a movement from the Rachmaninov Vespers 'Bogoroditsve Dvevo' (Ave Maria), which is a stunning item of choral music definitely not to be missed. On Sunday 15th December, we are doing 'The Bell Anthem' (Rejoice in the Lord Alway) by Henry Purcell. This 'verse' anthem has various sections for a solo alto, tenor and bass mixed in with 'full' sections for the whole choir. It affords us the chance to highlight some of the wonderful voices contained in our regular choir, and will be suitably jolly for Gaudete Sunday! The following Sunday (when we focus on the Virgin Mary) will see the morning anthem be Benjamin Britten's 'Hymn to the Virgin'. This is a piece for two choirs, one 'full' and one smaller that essentially 'answers' the full choir almost as an 'echo'. We will have a small group of singers (including some of our children) singing up at the high altar in musical answer to the 'full' choir back in the stalls. It is a beautiful and well constructed anthem which I very much hope you will enjoy.

9 Lessons and Carols will - once again - see our church filled with sound from an enlarged choir, the organ and a brass group joining them for the congregational carols. I am extremely grateful to the brass players who are colleagues and friends of mine that are generously giving up their time to play for this service for free due to current budgetary constraints. I think that everyone who was present at last year's service would agree they helped to bring significant value to the 9 Lessons and Carols Service, and so I hope you will enjoy this festive musical treat once again!

The choir will take a well-deserved Sunday off following Christmas, and will re-join for services in January.

From Thornbury with love: Christmas messages and aid head to Ukraine

Thornbury Benefice has joined forces with the local community and is continuing its support for people living in war-torn areas of Ukraine, providing essential supplies and Christmas messages with the crosscommunity 'Van collection for Ukraine' appeal.

Its twelfth supply-filled minibus departs this month, ensuring that practical aid, and a reminder of the Thornbury community's support, arrives just in time for Christmas.The bus contains essentials that are hard to find in Ukraine, including candles, warm socks and vitamins, and local Ukrainians have written 100 Christmas cards with handwritten messages in Ukrainian.

"For the people here, it's a way they can show their support," said Jacquie Rinaldi, a volunteer with the Ukrainian initiative. "People living in Ukraine face extended power outages and need items like candles to survive. Men on the front line have poor diets, living on packet noodles, and they need vitamins and medicine.

"We tuck the Christmas cards in with the supplies so families in Ukraine find these notes as they go through the boxes. It's a reminder they're not forgotten."

This year's journey faces additional challenges due to the rising costs of petrol and insurance. For the first time, they appealed for cash donations and raised over $\pounds600$.

"Our Ukrainian guests have become our friends and neighbours. We get to support them through Christmas, a time when they'd usually be surrounded by family."

Key to this effort is Thornbury's partnership with @BristolAid4Ukraine, a charity founded by Ukrainian Vera Stadon-Postavska and her husband, John. Their organisation arranged safe passage for the minibus, filled with donated supplies from Thornbury and South Glos to leave from Bristol to Stadon-Postavska's home community in Ukraine.

"We chose to support the minibus so it could be fully loaded on the way in and not return empty. Those with the paperwork in place, who are either injured or need to get out, can come back." The Ukrainian Initiative began in early 2022 when a group of local volunteers recognised the need for support as refugees arrived in Thornbury.

"Thornbury isn't like Bristol or Gloucester – it's a small town. We weren't prepared at first, but the effort has evolved into a truly community-driven initiative. Many local groups and churches contribute to the cause. The Methodist church now serves as a twice-weekly meeting space where Ukrainians can gather, share meals, and pick up essential supplies. The URC has donated a social room where Ukrainians meet every Friday, always joined by a recently formed Ukrainian ukulele band for practice."

The community continues to grow, with over 70 Ukrainian people still awaiting much needed hosts in Thornbury.

Nowhere do I get this feeling more than when experiencing carols, often the same ones sung by countless generations before me. It like a little bit of history reminding everyone about the ancientness of Christmas."

Katherine from Lydney said: "Midnight mass is a special moment for me. There is something magical about the midnight toll of the church bells as Christmas Eve turns into Christmas Day. The slightly tipsy smiles from some of the congregation, the delighted whispers of 'Happy Christmas', the gentle glow of candlelight and the resounding chorus of O Come All Ye Faithful fills me with such joy and thankfulness."
