WHY

- 1. We recognise God as the creator of our beautiful world, and that we are the stewards.
- 2. We acknowledge that we are in the middle of a climate crisis.
- 3. We accept that this is largely a result of human exploitation of the environment.
- 4. We recognise the effects this has on the planet and on people.
- 5. We need to act now to save our environment and protect people from the devastating effects of climate change.

HOW

As a church, both collectively and individually, we agree to:

- 1. Pray regularly for the environment and for people affected by the climate crisis.
- 2. Strive to be aware of how our all our actions may affect the environment.
- 3. Encourage conservation and biodiversity locally and worldwide.
- 4. Decrease waste and pollution.
- 5. Aim to reduce our carbon footprint by 10% [baseline: 24t CO2 in 2024]
- 6. Reduce our use of fossil fuels at home, in our transport and our travel.
- 7. Use food that is local, organic, animal-friendly, fair trade (LOAF) and home grown where possible.
- 8. Encourage ethical investment for savings.
- 9. Engage with local, national and international movements to combat climate change.
- 10. Monitor our progress annually.
