


# Holy Communion

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name.


Amen.

The deacon says:


Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N* Glory to you, O Lord.

Sermon

Please sit.

The Creed

Please stand.

Let us declare our faith together:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We Pray for Others

After each prayer, this or another response is used:

Lord in your mercy,

Hear our Prayer.

Then, at the end:

Merciful Father.

Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

### We Share Christ's Peace

Please stand.

Christ is our Peace, he has reconciled us to God in one body by the Cross; we meet in his name, and we share in his peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

The deacon says:

Let us share with each other a sign of Christ's peace

We all exchange a greeting of peace.

Hymn

During which the bread and wine are placed on the altar.

We Give Thanks

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.


We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

And now we give you thanks because, in the incarnation of the Word, a new light has dawned upon the world, that all the nations may be brought out of darkness to see the radiance of your glory.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:



We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood † of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:

'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

'Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

The deacon declares:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

Please sit or kneel.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name thy kingdom come, thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever.

Amen.


## The Breaking of the Bread

#### **Invitation to Communion**

Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you,
and feed on him in your hearts
by faith with thanksgiving.

The Communion

All are invited to come forward to receive Holy Communion.

You are very welcome to make your own decision as to whether to receive the bread alone or the bread and the wine.

Please indicate if you would like a gluten free wafer.

If you would rather receive a blessing, please keep your hands down and head bowed.

Please let one of the stewards know if you would like to receive Communion or a blessing in your seat.

The choir will sing an anthem.

**After Communion** 

We then pray together:

Almighty God,
we thank you for feeding us
with the body and blood
of your Son Jesus Christ.
Through him we offer you
our souls and bodies
to be a living sacrifice.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit
to live and work
to your praise and glory.
Amen.

Final Hymn

Please stand to sing the final hymn.

The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit † be among you and remain with you always.

Amen.

We are Sent

The deacon sends us out to serve others:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. In the name of Christ. Amen.
