Gary writes.....

Memory

The human brain is made up of more than 100 billion neurons! As we grow and develop, these neurons are 'wired up' to each other and communicate through thousands of connections, called synapses. Memories are formed when certain connections are strengthened.

Your memory is your brain's filing system. It contains everything you have learnt, and can store an amazing amount of information. We remember small things and huge things; we mark birthdays and anniversaries as rituals; we create special events which are unique to us and our close family and friends.

Throughout the Christian year we use rituals to remember. The account of Jesus' death and resurrection at Easter draws us into that remembering. It is the pivotal moment of truth for our faith as Christians.

Memory on its own can sometimes be debilitating – it can be a memory of what we once were, or might have become; we sometimes love the way things are, or even the past, too much. Accepting what our history has made us can sometimes cause us to be passive; we simply accept it and live with it, which in itself can undermine our individuality and choices.

The temptation is to be passive and do nothing! As we enter into the Easter season of new life and hope, we have an opportunity to engage with the memories which have brought

us to this place; the ways in which we have come to faith; the ways in which we might share those memories with others; and the ways in which God has called us and shaped us through the love of his Son, Jesus Christ.

It means we might need to do something a bit different; it's tempting of course not to bother.

'Notes from the Director of Music'

The month of April sees the 'business end' of the Passiontide Season, and we have a veritable feast of music for you to enhance the liturgy as a result!



The first Sunday in April sees a special service in the evening for 'Passiontide'. This service will move us through the Passion story, from Lent through to Holy Week and Easter itself. There are some absolutely fantastic musical items planned which the choir are already enjoying learning. These range from the beautiful Karl Jenkins 'Benedictus' (from the Armed Man), to one of the wonders of Renaissance polyphony - 'Ne Irascaris' by William Byrd, to a movement from the J. S. Bach 'Mass in Bm' (Gratias Animus Tibi). We are also going to sing Allegri's 'Miserere' (a setting of psalm 51), with its famous 'top C' soaring note for a soprano in several of the verses. We will welcome Hannah Davey as our soprano soloist for that service (who sang the beautiful 'Pie Jesu' in our Faure Requiem back in November), and she will also feature in the other musical item for this service - the 'Easter Hymn' by Mascagni. This is taken from the opera 'Cavalleria rusticana' (which features in The Godfather part 3...!), and is a movement full of power, passion and glory celebrating Easter. This will finish our service, taking us through the whole Passion story - and I hope we will see many of you there. It promises to be very special.

On Palm Sunday, we will sing an anthem by Grayston Ives called 'Ride on, ride on in majesty'. We have performed a couple of things by Ives over the last year or so including our current communion setting at 10am (the Ives 'Salisbury Service'). He is a gifted composer with a unique style. I'm sure you will enjoy. Hot on the heels of Palm Sunday is our special service for Maundy Thursday. This is always one of the most moving services of the church year - with its foot washing, leaving in silence, and having the altar of repose at the end. We will have some very beautiful music to accompany that service, including parts of William Byrd's '4 part mass' setting, and a setting of 'Ubi Caritas' by the modern composer Ola Gjeilo. If you don't know it, you are in for a treat. It is written for choir with the piano improvising linking sections between choral entries - and it is the most wonderful piece of music. I have no doubt it will greatly enhance the liturgy and moving nature of that service.

Following the glory of Easter Day, the choir will have a week 'off' from singing, and will return at the beginning of May to resume choral services.

Thank you all, as ever, for all your ongoing support of the music at St. Peter's Church. It is greatly appreciated.

Christ's final hours to be reenacted on the streets of Gloucester for Good Friday

On Good Friday, the streets of Gloucester will once again transform into a stage for a powerful reenactment of Christ's final hours in a play called 'The Way of the Cross'.

It's an open-air performance written and directed by Rachel Forrest, the vicar of Holy Trinity, Longlevens.

Rachel said: "We are telling the story of what happened to Jesus. Easter is a fun time with chocolate and Easter eggs, but there is also pain, suffering, generosity and sacrifice. It's important that we tell that story in the lead up to Easter as well.

"Jesus came as part of God, ministered for three years, healed, and taught about God's love. He was rejected, put to death on the cross, and then rose again. It's not a story of tragedy but of redemption and hope. That's the Easter promise. It's the ultimate story, and that's why we tell it."

This year will see the addition of The Ermine Street Guard, who are professional Roman soldier re-enactors. In 2024, 'The Way of the Cross' drew widespread attention, becoming the top story on *BBC Points West*. Churches across the diocese contribute to the performance which depicts the last hours of Christ's life, from his sentencing by Pilate to his crucifixion, which will unfold outside the Cathedral.

"Many spectators come with little or no understanding of Good Friday, while others find themselves deeply moved by the portrayal. For the cast, who have been rehearsing every Sunday throughout Lent, the experience is a spiritual journey, strengthening their personal connection to the story they are telling," Rachel said.

During rehearsals, a professional actor works with the performers, helping them with improvisation and working with each other. Much of the performance is ad-libbed, responding to the dynamics of the crowd and the setting. "The crucifixion scene is unseen by the cast until the actual performance. I rehearse that privately with the Roman soldiers and the actor playing Jesus," Rachel said. "It's powerful for everyone. I am very clear with the cast that when we step out of the Cathedral for the start of the reenactment, we are in 1st century Palestine. It is quite graphic, but Good Friday was graphic too."

The performance starts at 11am on Friday 18 April, beginning outside the Cathedral and going out onto the streets of Gloucester, before returning to the Cathedral for the final crucifixion scene, finishing just before 12pm. Rachel said: "I feel incredibly humbled and grateful to do this again. Every year it seems to grow."

'Online church live-streams and Zoom got me through those difficult days'

Janet Bannister, a lifelong Christian worshipping at St Giles, Uley, moved to France in 2019, just before the pandemic began. Since then, online church has given her a vital connection to her home church.

Janet remains actively engaged with her benefice through live streamed services, morning and evening prayer, and Lent study courses via Zoom. This technology proved invaluable during the difficult early days of the pandemic, particularly as she was also caring for her husband.

She said: "Without my church family in the UK, things would have been very bleak."

Janet encourages those who struggle with attending in-person services to give online services a try. She said: "Don't be afraid to try. It's anonymous, easy to

use, and doesn't require passwords or logins. Even with basic internet knowledge, it's simple. Plus, you can watch anytime, not just Sunday."

For Janet, live streaming has enhanced her connection to her faith community. "I can access services from different churches in my benefice, including ones I couldn't physically attend. Live streaming allows me to watch services at the appointed time or later, including weddings, funerals, and festivals.

"By using chat and following the rules, you connect with others who join every service. The leaders make everyone feel included, welcoming online viewers. Even if your benefice doesn't live stream, you can find alternatives."
