Gary writes.....

Rogation There is a lot for us to celebrate as we journey through the 40 days between Easter Sunday and Ascension Day. Along the way is Rogation Sunday, an often ignored moment when we celebrate how we, as humans, and our natural world 'live and move' together.

Rogation Sunday falls on the sixth Sunday of Easter in the Church of England's calendar of festivals, and is the Sunday immediately before Ascension (which for the record always falls on a Thursday).

Since medieval times there has been a tradition of 'beating the bounds' of the parish and praying for God's blessing upon the crops and the well-being of that particular settlement. Sadly, this tradition has become more and more forgotten by parishes today.

Rogation invites people to ask for a blessing for a particular place, for its inhabitants, and it joins everyone together in a commitment to play their part in looking after the local environment and each other.

It also recognises that there are 'modern day slaves' hidden in many rural (and urban) settings, with their 'work' unrecognised and grossly underpaid, and their well-being taken for granted or simply ignored.

How can we respond to this local need? Do we even know where it exists?

As churches, we take the opportunity to give thanks for God's provision, uphold it more carefully and share it more fairly, so that all may be a precious part of the fuller unfolding of God's goodness.

Do put this Sunday in your calendar; it falls on 25th May this year. We won't beat the whole bounds of St. Peter's parish, but we may do something around our beautiful churchyard after the 10am service instead.

There is a lot for us to celebrate as we journey through the 40 days between Easter Sunday and Ascension Day, but there is also the deeper challenge of rogation for us to think about as we proclaim 'Alleluia, Christ is risen!'

It was honour to be asked to be an Honorary Canon at Gloucester Cathedral by Bishop Rachel, thank you to all who came along to support me last month as I was collated and installed into the College of Canons therein.

The term canon comes from the Greek word *kanon* meaning *rule*. The College of Canons has its origins in the Cathedral's monastic foundation, when members of the original Abbey of St. Peter lived together under the rule of St. Benedict.

Canons pray for the life of, and act as ambassadors for the ministry of the Cathedral; their formal responsibility is to elect the Bishop of Gloucester, after the bishop has been nominated by the King.

I suppose you can now call me Rev Canon, or Canon, but I'd rather you just call me Gary.

'Notes from the Director of Music'



As we move into our post-Easter season, we will use the full communion setting that we've been using for the Sanctus/Benedictus/Agnus Dei as the Gloria is reinstated. Glory to God in the highest! It is the 'Salisbury Service' by Ives, and this will also be accompanied by our South African 'Alleluia' for the Gospel reading. We did it last year as well, as is just a welcome change away from the lovely Celtic Alleluia that we use during the rest of the year.

The month of May will see some lovely anthems being performed by the choir. We will sing an arrangement of the beautiful 'Brother James' Air' on the first Sunday, and the second Sunday will see the choir perform the fantastic 'Ye Choirs of New Jerusalem' by Stanford. This is full of colour, melodic beauty and drama as you'd expect from this stalwart composer of English choral music. The third Sunday will feature the deeply moving 'And I saw a new heaven' by Bainton. These are the most moving words taken from the end of the New Testament anyway, but they have been set to fantastic music - and it gives the tenors a moment in the spotlight each time the words come round for 'and God shall wipe away all tears'. Lovely stuff! The final anthem is 'Thou visitest the earth' by Greene for Rogation Sunday. This is a typical 'verse' anthem, with the main theme being sung by a solo or smaller group which the main choir then repeats afterwards. The choir will also sing for Ascension, and are performing an anthem called 'O sing joyfully' by Batten. This is, as the name suggests, a jolly piece from the English renaissance period.

The organ voluntaries are suitably triumphant as you would expect for this post=Easter period. The first Sunday will feature a piece by the modern composer David Blackwell, and is a triumphant march on 'Lux Eoi' (Alleluia, Alleluia, hearts to heaven and voices raise) which we all will have sung as one of the hymns during that service. The second Sunday will feature Handel's 'Hallelujah Chorus', played as the voluntary at the end of the service. The remaining two Sundays feature amazing repertoire by very different French composers. On the third Sunday, the voluntary will be 'Te Deum' (we praise thee O God) by Jean Langlais. This is loud and dissonant (you have been warned....!), and an expression of sheer power and glory to God. The most amazing thing about this organist/composer is that he was completely blind! The final voluntary is the exciting and uplifting 'Carillion-Sortie' by Mulet. This is quite toccata-like in its style, full of joy and majesty. I hope you will enjoy.

St Peter's Leckhampton bellringers outing

As well as the challenge of ringing on different bells, one of the joys of a bellringing outing is visiting very different churches and 'bagging' another tower. This is what sixteen members of St Peter's Leckhampton band and friends enjoyed on a sunny Saturday in April.

Expertly organised by Gilly Whittingham, the mix of learners and very experienced ringers rang a range of methods – from rounds and call changes to Surprise majors at five towers, all with very good bells. They enjoyed an excellent pub lunch at The Beaufort Arms in Hawkesbury too.

First stop was St Marv's Thornbury where the myriad of ladybirds in the bell tower were entertained by ringing on the eight bells. One of several historical boards in the ringing room celebrated the broadcast of these bells by the BBC on all programmes on Christmas Day 1946. They then moved on to St Mary's Olveston, initially needing strong people to raise the eight bells especially the tenor which at 18cwt, is considerably heavier than the 9cwt tenor at St Peters. The bells on plain bearings, have not been rehung since 1907 but rang

this time at Hawkesbury, with not so many steps to climb to the recently installed ringing floor on a gallery level overlooking the church. A very different experience on a new ring of eight bells on a steel frame. Installed in 2021, the first peal being rang there in January 2022 for the feast of St Wulfstan. Ringing here was Richard While's 150th tower

Although the new Hawkesbury Bells were designed by Matthew Higby and Co, based on a modern English profile, unusually they were cast in Milan, Italy by Emanuele Allanconi.

Holy Trinity Church at Wickwar, was next with six bells and a small octagonal ringing room. In recognition of the area Wells Surprise was rung. St Andrews Cromhall, the final stop, had thirty nine steps up to a smaller ringing room with six bells, the heaviest being 12 cwt. Here Gilly Whittingham celebrated ringing at her 100th tower.

Special thanks to all the towers for such a warm welcome and sharing their knowledge of the bells and their church history. It all added to a full (9.30 – 17.45) and memorable day.

The Messenger, May 2025 Anne's faith journey at The Door

Anne Townsend is Operations Manager at The Door, a Christian charity that provides opportunities and services like mentoring, youth centres, and support to young people and their families. She tells us about her vocation to her role at The Door.

Anne's journey began with a desire to gain experience and find a meaningful way to contribute to her community. After finishing her A-levels, she spent a year volunteering at The Door. "I really enjoyed my time volunteering. Everyone was kind and welcoming and the cause felt important. The Door doesn't just offer second chances; we offer third, fourth, fifth chances. Forgiveness is key in our work, and it's at the core of how we operate," Anne said.

Anne started looking for paid work, around the same time that The Door was looking for some administrative support. I didn't see it at first, but being at The Door has definitely been part of my faith journey, and part of God's plan for me.

"I was born into a Christian family, and I attended church throughout my life. I think, for a lot of young people that are born into that space, you accept it as just being normal, and then you start to ask questions as you get older.

I guess around the age of 16 or 17, I was like, yeah, cool, I'm in. This is me. Jesus is part of my life. But I never saw The Door as being part of my calling or my faith journey at that time.

"Since working here though, I've become more aware of God. I've learnt to listen to Him. Now, I see my role as using the gifts God has given me to serve others."

Anne's work is an inspiring expression of her faith. She is deeply involved in making sure that staff have the tools and support they need to make a difference in the lives of young people.

Due to working at The Door, Anne has found other opportunities to serve, working as Secretary for Churches Together, and volunteering at Christian youth camps and with The Door's Christian Outreach Arm, engaging directly with young people.

"It's incredibly rewarding to hear their stories, share my own faith journey, and walk alongside them as they explore their own."

Through these conversations and experiences, Anne sees the bigger picture of ministry; service to others doesn't always have to follow a traditional path.

Welcome to our new Archdeacon of Cheltenham

The Ven Katrina Scott was officially collated, installed and welcomed as Archdeacon of Cheltenham at the end of March.

She said, "The service was incredibly special. There were people from all parts of my life there – it felt like a real gathering of love and support."

Katrina has served in the Diocese of Gloucester since 2015, most recently as Area Dean of North Cotswold and Rector of a cluster of Cotswold parishes. As Archdeacon of Cheltenham, Katrina now supports churches and clergy across Cheltenham, Tewkesbury, Cirencester and the Cotswolds.

The role of an archdeacon involves both spiritual and practical leadership. At the service, the collation welcomes an archdeacon into the spiritual side of the role, while the installation focuses on the legal responsibilities. "My first priorities are lots of induction meetings and getting to know people – building relationships is the most important part."


