Gary writes.....

Living Stones

Over the past month we have been reflecting, during Morning Prayer, on Paul's letter to the Ephesians and the first letter of Peter.

Peter describes the church as God's spiritual temple, as follows:

'Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.' (1 Peter 2.5)

Peter's readers would have understood the living stones to be Israel.

He then applies the image of the 'cornerstone' to Christ, portraying the church as a living, spiritual temple with Christ as the foundation stone, and each believer a stone.

'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.' (1 Peter 2.7)

And, there's an interesting comparison here with Paul, who describes the church as a 'body', with Christ as the head, and each believer as a member of that body.

'We speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ, who is the head of his body, the church. He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love.' (Ephesians 4.15-16)

Both pictures emphasise 'community'.

One stone is not a temple or a wall; one body part doesn't function properly without the others.

In our (increasingly) individualistic society, it is easy to forget our interdependence with one another and other Christians. When God calls you to a task, remember that he is also calling others to work with you; and together your individual efforts will be multiplied.

Look for those people, and join them to help build God's kingdom!

And don't forget, we do this together as a 'priesthood of all believers'.

In Old Testament times, people did not approach God directly, only a priest could do that as an intermediary between God and (us) sinful human beings! But, with Christ's victory on the cross, that pattern changed and, now, we can come directly into God's presence without fear, and are given the responsibility of bringing others to him also.

When we are united with Christ as members of his body, as living stones in his spiritual temple, we join in with this priestly work of reconciling God's people.

How might we be living stones as we enter into these summer months?

'Notes from the Director of Music'



The month of June provides another rich, liturgical season for church musicians - particularly with Pentecost and Trinity Sundays in the mix! Our choir anthems this month are another mixture of styles for choir and congregation with various new items that I very much hope all will enjoy.

The first Sunday of the month has the choir performing a setting of 'Ave Maria' by the composer Archadelt. This simple anthem, written in a homophonic (chordal/hymn-like) style is beautiful in its slow moving simplicity, and the choir will perform this up at the high altar as per usual when we do something unaccompanied. Similarly, the 4th Sunday of the month will see the choir singing Palestrina's wonderful motet 'Sicut Cervus' (Like as the Hart desireth the water brooks). One of the all time great Renaissance motets, the choir are enjoying learning items such as this in a polyphonic style. The anthem for Trinity Sunday is Tchaikovsky's 'Hymn to the Trinity'. Again, this is unaccompanied and written in a number of 'verses', but with different endings to each. The final Sunday of the month will see the choir perform Cheltenham's own local composer, Gustav Holst's 'Turn Back O Man'. This anthem has a plodding, walking bass line throughout in the accompaniment, whilst the choir gradually build up singing the chorale/hymn-like tune over the top in various kevs until it reaches its climax at the end. Stirring stuff! However, the Sunday marking Pentecost will feature something a little bit different for the anthem! The choir are going to sing an arrangement of a fast/lively spiritual 'Every time I feel the spirit'. This has been arranged by the modern choral composer, Bob Chilcott - and we will be channelling our inner 'pentecostal gospel choir' as best we can. It's really fun, up tempo and something different to what we would normally sing (which you can tell from the descriptions of the other pieces above...) - but I hope you enjoy it as much as the choir do.

The organ voluntaries will be a mixture of styles and familiarity to you as well this month. Later in the month, there will be both the wonderful 'Postlude in Dm' by Stanford as well as the fantastic Chorale Prelude on 'Komm Heiliger Geist' (Come Holy Ghost) by J. S. Bach. On Trinity Sunday, there is a Fanfare and Trumpet Tune based on the hymn tune 'Nicea' (Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty) by the modern composer Christopher Tambling, and on the first

Sunday of the month, the voluntary is a jolly piece entitled 'Festival Finale' by Colin Mawby. This features a chord pattern/rhythmic pattern reminiscent of children in a playground teasing each other going 'nah, na-na, nah, nah'...! All good fun! For Pentecost, the voluntary is linked in with our jazzy offering for the anthem - as I play 'Ein Feste Burg' by the modern jazz composer Nagel. This fast and lively piece features jazz chords and syncopated rhythms throughout, but you should be able to hear snippets of the famous chorale 'Ein Feste Burg' (A Mighty Fortress is our God) throughout.

We will also be performing various items for the confirmation service as well so the choir is definitely working hard in the month of June!

An unexpected calling, from ministry to chaplaincy to ordination

"My journey to ordination came to life because of this job. Before I started here, I wouldn't have thought I'd be on this path, but being in this school has made it clear."

Matt Round has been working as a chaplain at All Saints' Academy, Cheltenham for over three years. For Matt, becoming a chaplain wasn't the path that he was expecting to follow – but it has had a significant impact on his sense of calling.

"Before I started at All Saints' Academy, I was working in full-time ministry at a non-denominational church in Manchester. I knew I wanted to have a job change, and that God was calling me into something else.

"Someone mentioned school chaplaincy. As I looked into it more, it just felt right. It allowed me to jump back into the world, and serve outside of the church setting. God made it quite clear that this is where he wanted me to be."

Three years on, in September, Matt will begin training for ordination, while continuing part-time at the academy.

"This role sparked my journey to ordination. It opened the door. I'm going to do my training whilst continuing here as a chaplain. I know that this is where I'm meant to be for the next chapter. I'm happy in this role, and I've become more open to where God might call me next," he said.

As a chaplain, Matt's role goes beyond leading worship and teaching about Christianity; he serves the entire school community, from students and staff to parents, volunteers and local neighbours.

"No day is the same. I've got my weekly rhythms, like collective worship and running the Alpha course, but I try to leave my schedule open. I might have a list of things to do, but then ten more things crop up that I wasn't expecting. It's a very people-focused role, so I try to be out and about, present during break times, lunch times, and around the school."

Although Matt doesn't always see the immediate impact of chaplaincy, he knows that his role is important to the wellbeing of the school community.

"In church ministry, I often saw the fruit of what I was doing. In school chaplaincy, you don't always get that. You say something and hope it lands, but you might never know. Sometimes I'm reading a Bible story in front of 400 students. Other times, I'm having a one-to-one chat where faith might not be the first thing we talk about. You have to sense what's helpful in that moment.

"Whether someone has faith or not, I'm here to support them. It's about presence, understanding, and care."
